On Monday, September 13, Oasis relaunched all classes and programs onsite. With big smiles and great hope, hundreds of women and children came through the Oasis doors, eager to reconnect and move forward with their education.

This could not have happened without you.

Since March of 2020, we've been oscillating between onsite and remote learning and serving grab-and-go meals, as COVID has flared and waned.

As this school year starts, the dining room is open so women and children can share their meals onsite. Hundreds of women are enrolled in onsite classes to learn English, complete their high school diploma, and learn computer and job skills. Many more children and teens are enrolled in Oasis after-school programs.

All this in a building enlarged by the recent (nearly complete!) expansion project. Thank you for your investment in this community.

Laverne's mother left early in her life. Her father did his best to raise her but he lost their home while she was a young teenager. She was homeless throughout her teen years.

"I was living from pillar to post," she says. "With nowhere to sleep each night, I couldn't keep up in high school." She dropped out.

The Oasis relaunch offers her a chance to restart her life. Laverne is pursuing her high school diploma so she can enroll in nursing school.

Nowadays, other than singing in her church choir, Laverne's only focus now is completing the GED.

"Oasis Saved Me" From Tutor to EMT



Shareek is an important role model for the Oasis after-school students. With donor support, he is pursuing his dream of becoming an EMT.

Nineteen-year-old Shareek graduated from Paterson's JFK high school in 2020, overcoming many challenges. His dream was to become an Emergency Medical Technician (EMT). He had no one to help him achieve his goal and no way of funding the training.

But now, Shareek has Oasis by his side.

Shareek started with Oasis as a volunteer in the After-School Academy. "I'm good with kids because I was always the babysitter in my house. I babysat my cousins—and everyone."

He later became an Oasis tutor and camp counselor. He now assists with maintenance and operations.

"I can honestly say Oasis saved me from becoming a bad person," he says. "Let's just say I had options: I could come to Oasis to work from 3 to 6, or I could chill with my friends. And my friends weren't always the best people."

"I can be myself at Oasis."

Shareek is on his way to greater things. With financial help from Oasis donors, he'll begin EMT training in January.

By the coming June, Shareek will be an EMT, serving his community. Passing it forward.

Life has presented Shareek with many obstacles. He continues to smile, work hard, and overcome.

With employment, these women improve their own lives and the lives of their children, with real potential to break the cycle of poverty.



When Summer Camp Leads a Family to Safety Your Support Truly Changes Lives

Below is an email about this year's summer camp, sent from an Oasis staff member to Jennifer Brady.

This summer felt so different. We had children who had lost parents, teachers, and other family members due to COVID. We had families trying to recuperate from COVID's impact.

Many of our students came to camp without the proper attire. The parents came asking for information about rental assistance and later, for help with getting school uniforms.

I'll never forget Jamie. His mom had been struggling with domestic violence for several years. Things became more difficult financially for her this past year, and she needed her husband's help with the rent. (He is her abuser.)

He refused to give her money unless she allowed him back into the house, so she let him stay. Jamie and his siblings saw a lot of fighting.

For Jamie, the summer program was a time to play safely and be a child. He said it was his best summer ever. He said he'd always remember walking across the Great Falls Bridge with his friends.

For Jamie's mom, the summer was a time to organize her affairs and work out a safe exit plan.

On the last day of camp, mom thanked me. She told me she was moving the children out of

state where they'd all be safe. I helped her with her transfer documents and provided her a few items for the children. She was so grateful.

The mom could not emphasize enough how much being at camp had helped Jamie. And how much camp had helped her.

I feel so blessed that I could be part of helping this family.
